

### **Institutional Health Indicators**

### Finances/Facilities/Auxiliaries

- 1. FY 2016 Debt Service Ratio of 6.02%
- AA- Stable Credit Rating
- 3. Fall 2014 Residential Life occupancy rate of 97%
- 4. OSU Foundation Endowment over \$900 million as of FY 2014; nearly double the FY 2009 value of \$455 million
- 5. Football Ticket Sales currently 92.3% of previous year total, with club seats at 93.4%
- Construction 80 construction/renovation projects completed at OSU-Stillwater totaling \$560 million;
   projects at \$307 million currently underway
- Research Expenditures have declined from \$163 million to \$138 million (▼15%) from FY 2009 to FY 2014
  - While overall research expenditures have decreased, the Division of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources faculty have increased the number of research awards (▲20%) and research funding per FTE (▲26%) in FY 2015.



## **Institutional Health Indicators**

### Recruitment/Enrollment/Student Performance/Rankings

#### 1. Recruitment and Enrollment Growth

- OSU-Stillwater new freshmen applications have increased by 4,720 (▲62%) over the last five years.
- Since Fall 2010, OSU Stillwater/Tulsa enrollment has grown by over 2,300 (▲ 10%). This is the largest increase (# and %) of any public Oklahoma institution.

#### 2. Student Retention and Graduation Rates

- First-year retention rate of 81.3% highest first-year retention rate in over 10 years.
- Four-year graduation rate of 38.7% consistent with Big 12 average.

### 3. National Exam Pass Rates and Job Placement Rates


- Center for Health Sciences' students have a 97% pass rate for licensing exam and a 98% residency match rate for the 2015 graduating class.
- Center for Veterinary Health Sciences has a 97% pass rate for national board exams and a 95% to 100% employment rate at graduation.






## **Budgeted Endowment Earnings**

- ❖ Earnings utilization has increased by over \$20 million since FY 2009.






## **OSU-Stillwater Undergraduate Enrollment**






## Student-to-Faculty Ratio Peer Comparison

- To reduce the student-to-faculty ratio to 19, OSU will need to increase faculty by an additional 30 positions.




# OSU Stillwater/Tulsa Faculty Salaries Compared to Peer




With 860 faculty, it would require approximately \$11.5M to get OSU to the peer average.





(claims paid as a % of total premiums collected)



### **OSU-Tulsa Helmerich Research Center**

### **Serving Engineering Students:**

- Mechanical Engineering undergraduate labs in Tulsa are moving to the HATRC.
- Material Science and Engineering, which started in FY 2013, conferred the first M.S. degree this year and could increase to 4 to 5 next year.



### ❖ Leveraging HATRC:

- Facilities use agreements incorporating an entrepreneurial approach to utilizing the Helmerich ATRC. Current agreements include:
  - NORDAM worldwide industry leader in the manufacture and repair of aircraft components
  - Three start-up companies

Discussions for future agreement with Small Business Development Centers of Oklahoma which includes:

- OSU New Product Development Center and Small Business Technology Council
- Project 360 in the Brady District with the George Kaiser Foundation and SSB Riata Center.
- Partnering in CEAT's proposal with the Oklahoma Center for Advancement of Science & Technology and the National Institute of Standards and Technology for a manufacturing development center

### **Athletics**

- ❖ Football season ticket sales are currently 92.3% of last year's total; club level are 93.4%; student tickets just went on sale.
- Newly Approved NCAA Legislation and the continued need for improvement to facilities creates challenges for intercollegiate athletics.

### Stillwater Residential Life

- University Commons is on schedule for August 1<sup>st</sup> occupancy and will provide 966 beds within three buildings.
- Due to increased enrollment, Kerr-Drummond will be needed to accommodate 450 additional students in need of campus housing.
- With the use of Kerr-Drummond, occupancy rates are projected to be near 100% for Fall 2015.
- Construction on the new dining facility located by University Commons has begun and scheduled to open in Summer 2016.

- University Store named as the best-managed, self-operated book store in the nation by peer store affiliates.




- Fall 2014 clothing and brand presence expanded by opening OSU apparel store in Tulsa mall over the holiday season.


