OSRHE Budget Actions Affecting Budgets of Institutions

- \$16.4M allocated through the State Regents' performance funding formula to provide funding for institutional priorities.
- \$11.5M targeted to Critical Workforce Development Initiatives to be used at the discretion of each institution for their most critical STEM needs. Funds will be guaranteed for three academic years and then reassessed. Funding is considered "at-risk" based upon future STEM degree production.
- \$17.4M allocated to address the critical shortage of teachers in the state through a Future Teacher Scholarship program and an Employment Incentive program for retention.



OSRHE Budget Actions Affecting Budgets of Institutions

- Section 13 Offset Program increased by \$2.1M which now provides a minimum of \$1.0M or \$175/per FTE, whichever is greater, to participating institutions.
- \$8.6M provided for financial aid and scholarship programs of which \$4.0M was directed toward concurrent enrollment to be reimbursed at 100.0% of total eligible waivers provided to high school juniors and seniors.
- Oklahoma Promise scholarship program will receive \$65.4M for FY 2023.
