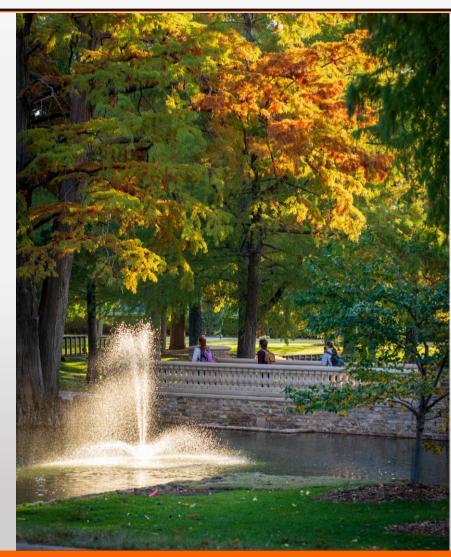

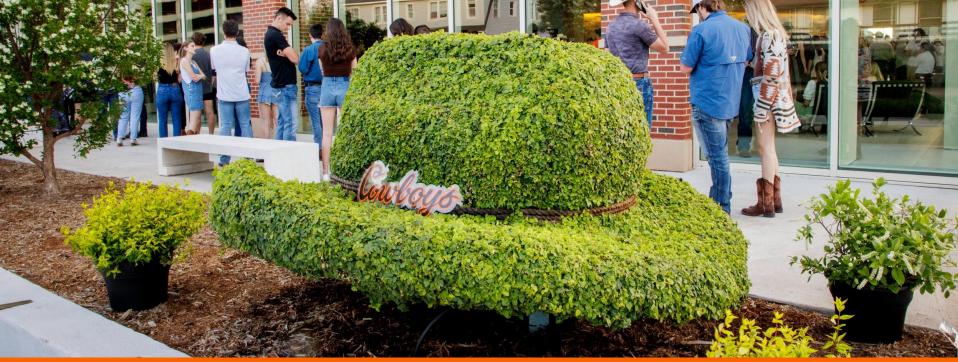

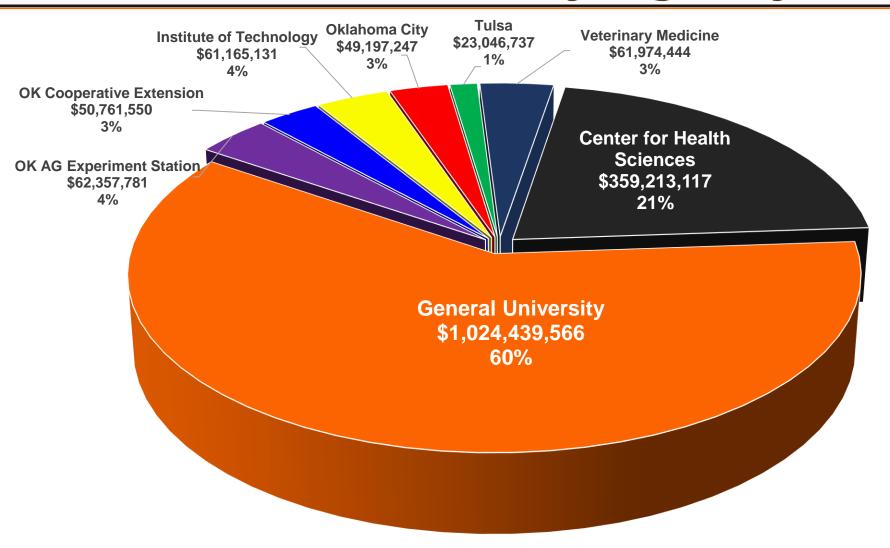

FY 2024 Additional State Funding

In addition to Section 13 Offset and waiver reimbursements, OSU System continues to receive additional funds to be used at the discretion of institutions for STEM programs leading to degrees on Oklahoma's Top 100 Critical Occupations. This initiative is in the second year, with funding guaranteed for three academic years, at which point it will be re-evaluated for possible reallocation.

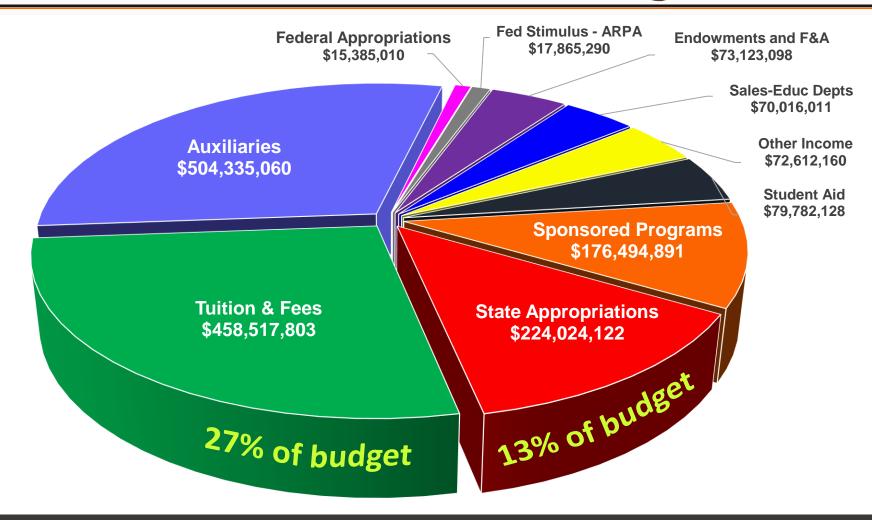

Sources Of Revenue – All Agencies



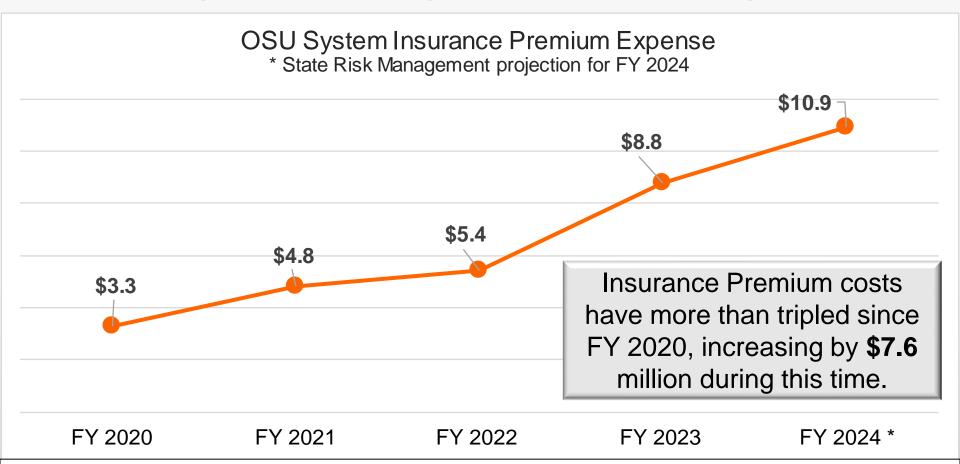

OSU Strategy: maintain an effective and efficient OSU System.

Approval is Requested to Implement a 3% Merit Raise Program for OSU Agencies

- > Salary program will be effective as of July 1st.
- ➤ The last July 1st salary program was ten years ago.
- All full-time, continuing faculty, staff and administrators are eligible.
- Program is based on merit.
- Increases should range around the average of 3%.
- > Total system cost = \$12.3 million

OSU Strategy: attract and retain high-talent faculty and staff.

OSU Continues to Maintain Affordability

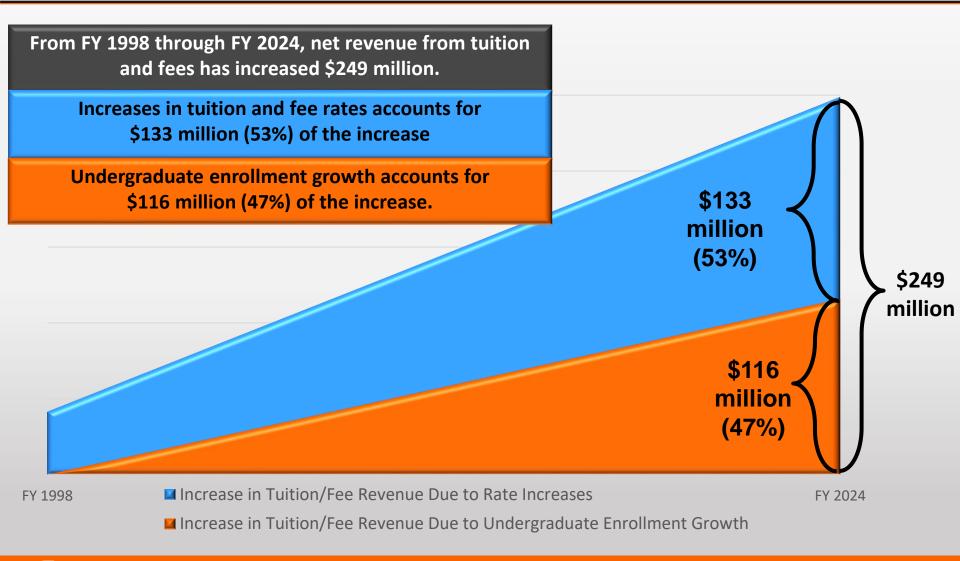
OSU-Stillwater UG Resident Tuition/Mandatory Fee Increases:

5-Yr. Avg. Annual Increase= 0.5%

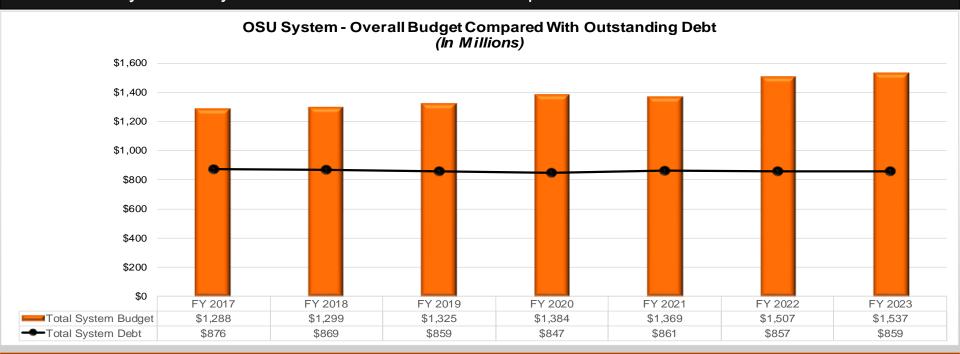
Enrollment Growth and Rate Increases Account for Increased Tuition/Fee Revenue



OSU Continues to Practice Fiscal Responsibility

Credit Ratings:

- With Ratings of AA- from both Standard & Poor's Endowment and Fitch Group, <u>OSU</u> maintains the highest credit rating of any higher education system in Oklahoma.
- S&P Global assessed OSU's profile as "extremely strong," while Fitch Group noted the University's stability and sound financial stewardship.

OSU Audited Net Position OSU System and Stillwater Agencies

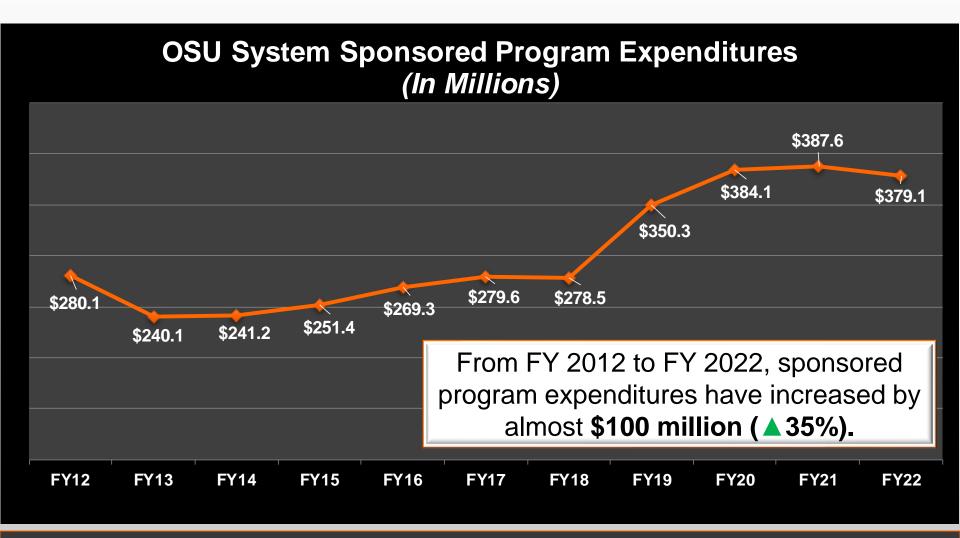


Endowment Earnings Incorporated Into the Institutional Budget



Incorporating endowment earnings into the institutional budget helps OSU minimize increases in student costs. For example, FY 2024 endowment earnings of \$36.6 million incorporated into the General University budget is equivalent to a 17.9% increase in tuition and fee rates.
